

Workplace Law Update: January 2025

MBEX is here to help our members stay on top of the latest changes and have an action

plan for compliance when it comes to workplace laws.

Here is a quick overview of some critical developments that have happened since December and essential items you should consider addressing in January and beyond.

1.) Get Ready for the New Administration

Catch up on workplace law developments to expect from the Trump administration, as well as President-elect Trump's picks to lead the <u>Labor Department</u> and the <u>Federal Trade Commission</u> and for roles like the <u>Border Czar</u> and the <u>nation's first Al Czar</u>.

2.) Be Strategic as You Plan for 2025

With so many changes taking place, it's hard to make accurate predictions about what we'll see in the workplace in the coming year. Fisher Philips asked their firms thought leaders to develop their best predictions to help. Read the entire FP Workplace Law 2025 Forecast here, or you can check out this Insight for the top 10 predictions pulled from the report.

3.) Check your Compliance List for the New Year

Did you track all the federal and state workplace law changes that took effect on January 1st that will impact your business? From minimum wage rate to paid sick leave to labor laws --- and more --- it can be hard to keep up with all the new rules for the new year. Here to help is this handy cheat sheet.

4.) Keep Tracking Legal Developments

Not all laws take effect on January 1st, so you'll need to track developments throughout the year --- even later in January. For example, in the construction industry, you'll need to comply with a new OSHA rule effective January 13th requiring employers to provide personal protective equipment (PPE) that properly fits workers based on their unique body type. This rule is particularly important given the rising number of women that work in the construction field.

5.) Prepare for Big Changes to H-1B, H-2A & H-2B Visa Programs

Federal immigration officials recently finalized sweeping changes to the <u>H-1B visa program</u> and issued final rules to modernize the H-2A and H-2B temporary worker programs --- all of which take effect on January 17th, just three days before the Trump administration begins.

6.) Monitor Litigation Over the Corporate Transparency Act (CTA)

If you followed the whiplash-inducing turn of events regarding the CTA, you know that businesses are currently not subject to the January 13th Reporting Rule deadline that would have required corporate and personal information to be disclosed to the government. The 5th Circuit halted the rule just three days after another panel of the same appeals court had revived the reporting requirements. Here's a quick review of the recent developments and a plan of action.

7.) Dive into the House's Sweeping Al Report

The U.S. House Bipartisan AI Task Force just released a groundbreaking report on December 17th that outlines key challenges and opportunities for AI adoption across all sectors. As artificial intelligence reshapes workplaces, employers should act now to stay one-step ahead of this exciting but turbulent period.

8.) Review Key Labor Law Developments

In a significant move on December 10th, the <u>National Labor Relations Board (NLRB)</u> overruled a Trump-era ruling and made it more challenging for unionized employers to make workplace changes without bargaining over the change with the union. While it's expected the incoming administration will flip the Board and install members who will return the playing field to an even level, you will need to comply with this new standard until this case is once again overturned.

9.) Be Prepared for Increased Workplace Safety Scrutiny

For the very first time, OSHA has publicized the comprehensive details on the nearly 900,000 reported workplace injuries and illnesses recorded by the agency in 2023, which may result in increased scrutiny toward employers from OSHA and the public alike. The December 12th release marks a significant development in workplace-safety transparency and has important implications for employers nationwide.

Minnesota Housing has officially released its RFP for a grant program that provides up to \$100,000 for schools. The program supports public schools in creating opportunities where students can gain construction skills while building housing for low-income families.

The Housing Challenge Funds for Schools RFP is a competitive application process that deploys Economic Development and Housing Challenge funds authorized under Minnesota Statute Section 462A.33.

Macalester's 'Welcome Center' Project Advances

Macalester College is making progress on plans for its new welcome center and residence hall, a roughly \$100-million project that will give Macalester its first new student housing in 25 years.

The plans hinge in part on a rezoning process that's expected to wrap up by the end of the month. This week, the St. Paul City Council heard the "first reading" of a project-related rezoning ordinance. The second reading and a public hearing are scheduled for January 15th, followed by final adoption on January 22nd.

A handful of parcels on Grand Avenue and Macalester Street are up for rezoning, which would pave the way for construction. Surface parking, a vacant lot, and "college campus uses" currently occupy the project site, according to city documents.

A project narrative reveals plans for a five-story building with a welcome center on the main level and a 224-bed residence hall on the top four stories. Included in the welcome center plans are a large lobby space, offices for admissions staff, and a "coffee-type shop" that will be open to the public.

Macalester's project team includes McGough (construction), HGA (Design), and TEN x
