There are several key changes to Minnesota's labor laws taking hold in 2025 that will specifically impact construction.

These include:

- Changes to the state's Earned Sick and Safe Time
- The new 14-factor independent contractor requirement
- Increases in minimum wage rates for all employers
- Inclusion of starting minimum and maximum annual salaries in job postings

She will also touch on escalation clauses in construction contracts as a way to handle possible inflationary pricing due to proposed tariffs by the incoming administration.

Along with hearing from Kate, we will be announcing the results of the 2025 MBEX Board of Directors election, welcoming those new members as well as showing appreciation to those departing the Board.

Additionally, two special member recognition awards will also be presented at this event: Volunteer of the Year and Distinguished Member of Service.

ECONOMIC REPORTS

□ Construction Starts Increase 5% in November

Total construction starts increased 5% in November to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$1.2-trillion. Nonresidential building starts grew 2%, nonbuilding starts moved 16% higher, while residential starts fell 1%. Manufacturing starts were down 40%, commercial starts were up 5%, and institutional starts were 18% higher for the 12-months ending November 2024. (Dodge Construction Network)

INFRASTRUCTURE

□ Congress Passes, Biden Signs Continuing Resolution, Staving Off Government Shutdown

Federal funding for construction and infrastructure programs will remain at current levels until mid-March 2025, under a stopgap spending measure passed by Congress on December 20th. Other disaster relief spending in the CR includes: \$3.4-billion to repair storm damage at U.S. Department of Defense installations; \$3.1-billion for drinking water and wastewater infrastructure improvements; and \$1.5-billion to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for rehabilitation and repairs, studies and projects to reduce the risks of future disasters, and to address water infrastructure needs. ☐ Building Concrete on Mars From Local Materials

Imagine you've just gotten to Mars as part of the first contingent of settlers. Your first challenge: build a long-term habitat using local materials. Those might include water from the polar caps mixed with specific surface soils. They might even require some very personal contributions --- your blood, sweat, and tears. Using such in situ materials is the challenges a team of Iranian engineers studied in a research project looking at local materials on Mars. (*Phys.org*)

PROJECT TO WATCH

□ Data Center Developer Pitches 447-Acre Project in Rosemount

An entity tied to Denver-based Tract has put forward plans to transform an eight-parcel site in Rosemount, which is currently farmland located along Courtyard Boulevard and bordering Hastings. The company confirmed that it is in the early stages of working with the city on a potential data center campus on the site. The proposal is currently undergoing the Alternative Urban Areawide Review environmental-review process with the Minnesota Environmental Quality Board. Construction is expected to begin in 2025. (Minneapolis-St. Paul Business Journal)


