# AGC & Arcoro's 2024 Workforce Shortage Survey

The nation's failure to invest in construction workforce education and training programs is having a real, measurable impact on the country's ability to build infrastructure and other construction projects, according to the results of this workforce survey conducted by the Associated General Contractors (AGC) of America and Arcoro, the leading HR technology company supporting the construction industry.

Noting that 94% of contractors report they are having a hard time filling open positions, construction officials called on federal leaders to adopt better workforce policies.

"The most likely path to addressing construction workforce shortages is for the federal government to adopt better workforce policies," said Jeff Shoaf, the association's chief executive officer, during a virtual media briefing to release the results. "Federal officials need to support, instead of undermine, our national infrastructure and economic development policies."

# Construction Among Top Trade Jobs in the U.S.

A new report has named the top 10 most in-demand jobs in the U.S., with engineering and construction roles at the top of the list.

The research, carried out by the experts at Pro Tool Reviews, has found the most indemand and highest-paying trade jobs in the U.S. by analyzing the average wages, the state with the highest wages, the most common job roles, and the roles with the most employment opportunities.

#### The 10 Most In-Demand Jobs in the U.S.

- 1.) Maintenance and Repair Worker
- 2.) Construction Laborer
- 3.) HVAC Installer
- 4.) Electrician
- 5.) Pipefitter, Plumber, and Steamfitter
- 6.) Heavy Equipment Operator
- 7.) Machinist
- 8.) Sheet Metal Worker
- 9.) Carpenter
- 10.) Industrial Machinery Mechanics

#### Additional research also revealed:

- The vacancy surge for HVAC installers is likely driven by new building constructions, renovations of existing structures, and the increasing focus on energy efficiency and climate control technologies in living and working environments.
- Elevator and escalator installers are the biggest earners when it comes to trade jobs, with an average annual wage of more than \$100,000.
- The highest-earning state for tradespeople is Hawaii, with an average annual salary of \$79,770 for construction and extraction workers.
- Maintenance and repair workers are the most common construction trade in the U.S., with more than 1.5 million employees across the country.
- Welding jobs are more searched for than any other in the U.S., with over 338,000 Google searches in the last year.

U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics were used to find the following data for each relevant job under the "construction and extraction" sector as of May 2023: Mean Hourly Wage, Annual Mean Wage, and Number of Employees. The same data source was used for the geographic profile for each trade job as of May 2023. Information was also gleaned from LinkedIn, Indeed, and Glassdoor to find the number of job opportunities for each trade in the U.S.

SAR allows researchers to inspect and characterize pavements, retaining walls, and embankments from space and can help determine if there are flaws that should be further inspected for repair, saving valuable time. # □ Former Golf Course in St. Paul is Being Transformed Into an All-Electric Housing Development

Construction is underway in St. Paul, Minn., on a major affordable housing development that will combine solar, geothermal, and all-electric appliances to create one of the regions largest net-zero communities. Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity broke ground in June on a four-block, 147-unit project on the site of a former golf course that's being redeveloped by the city and its port authority, which made the decision to forgo gas hookups. # Burnsville Clears Hurdle for City Hall Expansion

The city of Burnsville is one step closer to remodeling and adding to its current city hall and police headquarters, after the planning commission held a hearing about the expansion at its August 26th meeting.

The expansion will more than double the square footage of city hall and police headquarters from its current 95,659-square-feet of space to 215,933-square-feet, according to public documents.

The type of parking on the property is also likely to shift around. Police headquarters will receive a parking lot that will grow from 31 total stalls to 74 stalls. The number of stalls in the city hall lot will move from 136 down to 72, documents say, though some of this will be offset from a new lot of 25 stalls that will be built where only city vehicles can park.

The need for training space for police officers and the Behavioral Health Unit at the Burnsville Police Department is also a reason for the expansion.

The city is looking to collect bids on the project "in a couple of months," with the hope of starting construction in mid-2025. Construction is expected to be done in phases over three years, ending sometime in 2028.
